## Answering Common Untruths and Anti-Semitic Comments

1. Jews know the Bible way better than I do—I could never witness to them. Many of today's Jews never even pick up their Bibles and many can't locate books in the Bible.
2. Jews have their own covenant. We don't need to witness to them. Jesus came for the lost sheep of Israel (Mt. 15:24). Paul, when entering a new city on his missionary journeys, always went to the Jews first-- Acts 13:13-52; 14:1-4; 18:7-11; 19:8-10.
3. Jews killed Jesus. Why should we go to them? First, Jesus was the Passover Lamb. Only Jewish people made sacrifices unto the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. Naturally, they would be involved in the sacrifice. Second, Jesus stated, "Just as the Father knows me and I know the Father, and I lay down my life for the sheep. And I have other sheep that are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason, the Father loves me because I lay down my life that I may take it up again. *No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down, and I have authority to take it up again. This charge I have received from my Father.*"—John 10:15-18.
